Wondering where Sunrise stands, we checked out the District 5300 web page for such things. It reports that our February attendance percentage was 41%, which ranked us 45th out of 60 clubs in the district. Our YTD percentage of 64.5%, however, ranked 16th. The average for all 60 clubs for February was 56.50%; YTD, 71.33%. Looks like a lot of Rotarians were somewhere else in February. Our membership growth (net two, or 5%, so far), ranked us 12th in the district (most clubs have net losses in membership), and our membership retention percentage (97.5%) put us near the top. Hmmm.
