Hey buddy, can you spare a dime?

The refrain is a depression-era period piece not heard much these days, but May's issue of *Rotarian* takes up a new tack on the subject: Rotary's commitment to a world without poverty through the UN Millennium Development Goals. (See pp. 44-48) The article, provocatively subtitled "Imagine...." (p. 46) is the first in a special series.

The more extensive section immediately preceding (pp. 27-43, with lots of photos) includes three articles about *microcredit* programs. The first reports on one such program in Honduras initially funded by a \$500,000 Health, Hunger and Humanity Grant from The Rotary Foundation. The second (pp. 36-37) provides advice from three US Rotarians (two from San Diego) and one from Calcutta, India, with experience with such projects. The third reports on programs organized by the Rotary Club of Calcutta, India, and

concludes with a 9-step how-to-do-it sidebar.

Newer members of Sunrise may be interested to know that our club participated in the program about a decade ago, with a grant to an organization called **FINCA**, which made microcredit loans to persons in Central America. Hmmm.

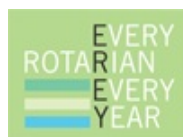
