It means taking the time to see what our communities need and to decide which of those needs we can meet most effectively. It means sharing what we have with those around us, as well as with those we will never have the chance to meet.

From that beginning, President Wilf references some of RI's programs – health, literacy, water, etc. – some of which we're already responding to. Here's his challenge: "...I will ask all of you to say yes to the challenges that being a Rotarian will bring you. .... Yes, I will turn that idea into a project, and I will lead the project to completion. Yes, I will share my skills, time, and resources with my club and with those who need my help. Yes, I will share Rotary with others, by bringing a qualified new member into my club."
